From the Pastor, November 2020

If you are a Peace Lutheran member, perhaps you noticed or will soon read a startling figure in the church council meeting minutes from October. In the stewardship section of the minutes at financial report it says, "giving is down approximately 45% below budget." Yikes! That is a pretty scary number, 45% below budget! The reality of the pandemic and its consequences are now showing their effects on Peace Lutheran's financial status. So many of Peace Lutheran's members have been sending in their regular offering support and



many are doing electronic giving, for that we are extremely grateful! But the time when the church wasn't worshiping in person from March to May, our lack of attendance by our regular members and limited visitors coming to check us out has taken its toll on our projected income for the year.

Thankfully, the church did receive a small PPP Loan which has carried us through the summer months, but that number- 45% below budget - still looms largely in my mind. I'm also grateful to all who supported the summer rummage sale fundraisers which were a great help to our budget. And the church is still planning to do its annual lefse fund raiser this month. With the help of volunteers to mix lefse, roll it, package and sell it, the church will get another boost of income to the budget. You can help with this fund raiser by donating supplies and spending time at the church making lefse. See the information about this project in the rest of the newsletter.

Peace Lutheran's focus for November: Samaritan's Purse Operation Christmas Child



Kool Gang and Confirmation students next service project is the Samarian's Purse Operation Christmas Child. This project fills shoe boxes with toys and other fun items and delivers them to children in need around the world. The congregation is invited to join the youth in collecting gift items for the shoe boxes. The pickle jars will also be passed around in November to collect change to help cover the shipping expense of the shoe boxes. (Each shoe box costs \$9.00 to ship.) On Wednesday November 20th the shoe boxes will be packed and deliv-

ered to a collection site in Dickinson.

The following is a list of appropriate items that you can donate for the shoeboxes.

A "WOW" Item such as a doll, stuffed, animal, soccer ball with a pump, shoes, musical instruments

Toys such as cars, jump ropes, yo-yos, toys that light up and make noise (with extra batteries)

Non-liquid Hygiene items such as toothbrushes, washcloths, bar soap, combs

School Supplies such as pens, pencils, crayons, notebooks, markers, sharpeners, coloring books, solar calculators

Accessories such as socks, hats, sunglasses, jewelry, watches, flashlights with batteries, hair clips

Please Do Not Include candy, toothpaste, gum, war related items, seeds, food, liquids or lotions, medications or vitamins, breakable items or glass containers, or aerosol cans.

Dear Siblings in Christ,

Our lives and our world were turned upside down this year due to COVID-19. It seems we could wake up every day with something new to fear. There are serious challenges facing our world: a pandemic, politics, economic hardships, fires, and hurricanes. It is no wonder that our nerves are frayed.

Is there an opportunity hidden in this crisis? Reading in Matthew 5:14-16, the disciples do not just carry the light – they *are* the light of the world in the same way as Jesus' life and salvation. As members of Christ's body, we too are meant to shine the light of the gospel in a darkened world.

How can we *Be the Light*, as we reach out and engage with people – to be the light and bring out the Godcolors in the world?

Peter Soli, trainer, and coach at Dialogue Works, suggests three areas for opportunity:

Congregations will focus on what is most important in their life together,

New leaders will show up, established leaders will do new things and responsibilities will be clarified, The question of how we are Church together grows in importance.

Starting in March of this year, the methods your synod staff adopted to approach ministry were unlike anything we experienced before. We had to adapt and adopt new digital tools and resources for ministry. Gathering face-to-face with lively interactions or deep discussions has been disrupted.

The Western North Dakota Synod Annual Appeal effort will focus on funding the staffing resources necessary to adopt new methods of seeking, identifying, and inviting future leaders for the church during this time of using creative ways and technology to meet people
